PH.1	Monitor Community Health Status
PH.1.1	Does the policy consider public health impact related to repetitive and/or cumulative exposures to health hazard? ⁱⁱ
PH.1.2	Is there a system in place to monitor for community health issues related to the sector and is public reporting made available? ⁱ
PH.1.3	Does the policy acknowledge the social determinants of health related to the policy outcome (e.g. socioeconomic status, neighborhood, age, education, etc.)? ⁱⁱⁱ
PH.2	Diagnose and Investigate Health Problems
PH.2.1	Is there a system in place to reduce harmful exposures? ⁱⁱⁱ
PH.3	Educate
PH.3.1	Is educational information made available to inform public of potential health risks? ⁱ
PH.4	Mobilize Community Partnerships
PH.4.1	Is there allowance for community mobilization to monitor and act on health risks? ⁱ
PH.5	Develop Policies that Support Individual/Community Health Efforts
PH.5.1	Are there human health co-benefits present (e.g. walkability, clean air, adaptive capacity etc.)? ⁱⁱⁱ
